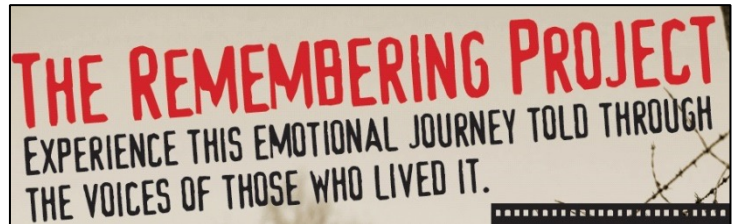


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SUNRISE SUNSET DOCUMENTARIES' "THE REMEMBERING PROJECT"
SELECTED A WINNER IN THE 35th ANNUAL TELLY AWARDS

(South Euclid, Ohio 6/8/15) -Sunrise Sunset Documentaries has been named a Bronze winner of the 35th Annual Telly Awards for the video titled "The Remembering Project." With nearly 12,000 entries from all 50 states and numerous countries, this intergenerational storytelling project created for Montefiore stood out for its poignant and moving depictions of surviving the Holocaust.

The Remembering Project, which premiered on January 13, 2015 at Montefiore, features four Cleveland-area Holocaust survivors who shared their moving and painful stories with Natalie Bauman, of Sunrise Sunset Documentaries, and four local high school students. Funded by a grant to Montefiore by the 2015 Saltzman Youth Panel of the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, the project continues to address education in the Jewish community by making the video and accompanying study guide available to interested educators, museums and organizations.

The participants, including Montefiore residents Irene Weiner and her husband Marvin, all recognized the value of sharing their stories and ensuring that people know the truth.

"She never wanted to talk much about it during the 55 years that we've been married," Marvin said of his wife, Irene. "She did tell me about her being taken to Auschwitz from Hungary in the "cattle" cars. To this day, she's scared of tight spaces because they remind her of her experience."

The Telly Awards was founded in 1979 and is the premier award honoring outstanding local, regional, and cable TV commercials and programs, the finest video and film productions, and online commercials, video and films. Winners represent the best work of the most respected advertising agencies, production companies, television stations, cable operators, and corporate video departments in the world.

A prestigious judging panel of over 500 accomplished industry professionals, each a past winner of a Silver Telly and a member of The Silver Telly Council, judged the competition, upholding the historical standard of excellence that Telly represents. The Silver Council evaluated entries to recognize distinction in creative work - entries do not compete against each other - rather entries are judged against a high standard of merit. Less than 10% of entries are chosen as Winners of the Silver Telly, our highest honor. Approximately 25% of entries are chosen as Winners of the Bronze Telly.

"The Telly Awards has a mission to honor the very best in film and video," said Linda Day, Executive Director of the Telly Awards. "Sunrise Sunset Documentary's accomplishment illustrates their creativity, skill, and dedication to their craft and serves as a testament to great film and video production."

"There were so many moments during the videotaping that I was aware of being a witness to history and it was an amazingly moving project to help create," said Natalie Bauman of Sunrise Sunset Documentaries. "The responsibility of passing on their experiences to the next

generation was an important motivator for the interviewees, even though they relive the horrific losses and memories every time they tell their stories.”
